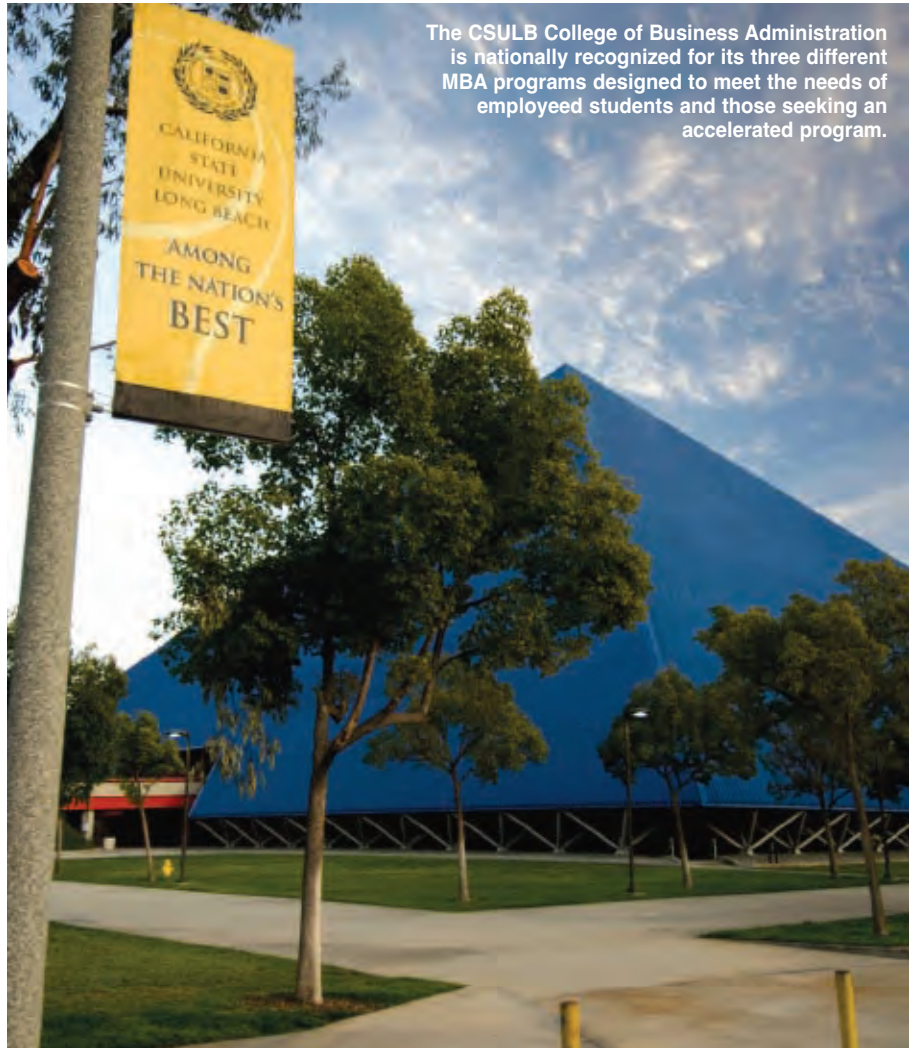

California State University, Long Beach

California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) has long been a destination for Orange County's best and brightest high school and community college graduates.

The close proximity to the line separating two of the state's largest counties not only set the stage for serving students from both counties, but it actually had a hand in determining the campus' original name when it was established in 1949 — Los Angeles-Orange County State College. The campus has come a long way since then, earning a national reputation for academic excellence with the focus on student education and service.

In April, CSULB was among only 15 public universities in the country recognized in a major national report for outperforming similar institutions in helping students stay on track and graduate. Published by the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB), the report, "Promoting a Culture of Student Success: How Colleges and Universities are Improving Degree Completion" profiles 15 four-year colleges and universities and outlines approaches and strategies used to boost student success.

The SREB report noted: "A common theme emerged in interviews with students, faculty, staff and administrators: the university's overall focus on graduation. While the CSU [California State University] system has emphasized degree completion for many years and monitors each university's progress, CSULB stresses more than just the numbers. As one person on campus said, 'Completion serves as the standard used to weigh every significant decision.' Another added, 'There is no one thing here, no magic bullet, but rather a mosaic effect that gets everyone — from senior administrators to the grounds crew — to understand their role in helping students graduate.'"

"This report further validates the ongoing efforts of our faculty and staff to ensure that all of our students achieve their education goals," said CSULB President F. King Alexander. "The success of this university through the years is the result of a dedicated campus community — faculty, staff and administrators who have committed themselves to making Long Beach the university of choice for students throughout the state."

OC's University of Choice

From the beginning, CSULB has been that university of choice for large numbers of Orange County students, as the data demonstrate. More than 25 percent of the CSULB student body resides in Orange County, including more than 9,000 of its undergraduate students. Additionally, nearly 25 percent of CSULB's more than 250,000 alumni have made their primary residence in the OC. That's more than 62,000 graduates of the university living and working in the county.

"Cal State Long Beach graduates live all over the world, but about 25 percent of them choose to live and work in Orange County," Alexander pointed out. "When you add up all of our alumni, current students, faculty and staff, you are talking about a significant number that has a great deal of impact on the quality of life and economics in Orange County."

Still, there is more to CSULB's popularity among Orange County students than just proximity. Beyond SREB's recognition this past spring, the reputation of the university is recognized both regionally and nationally, not only for its academic quality but for its affordability as well.

CSULB was again ranked the fourth best university among all public master's universities in the western United States by *U.S. News & World Report* in its 2010 edition of "America's Best Colleges Guide."

Also, CSULB was again listed among the nation's 50 "Best Value" public colleges by The Princeton Review, which teamed up with *USA Today* to present its list of the 100 "Best Value Colleges for 2010." Cal State Long Beach was the only CSU campus to earn this distinction.

"While it is particularly difficult for large public universities to rank well under the *U.S. News & World Report* methodology, we are extremely pleased to see Cal State Long Beach continue to do well among this publication's rankings," Alexander explained. "The Princeton Review recognition is also a

significant one for our campus. The ranking indicates to taxpayers, consumers, students and parents that the high price tag associated with many colleges and universities nationwide has nothing to do with the quality of the education experience being offered."

Evidence of university's growth — beyond the number of its students who make it one of the state's largest-enrolled campuses — is everywhere. Again, serving students better in and out of the classroom is central to its expansion.

This month the campus' \$61 million Student Recreation and Wellness Center will be open to serve students, alumni, faculty and staff. The 126,000-square-foot facility offers: weight and fitness machines; a wellness center; rock-climbing wall; indoor running track; basketball, volleyball, badminton, racquetball and multi-activity courts; outside recreation pool and spa; sand volleyball; health food shop; personal trainers; and group fitness classes.

New Science Building

The university is in the process of building one of the largest science buildings in the CSU system. Slated to open in 2011, the 160,000-square-foot Hall of Science will house the departments of Geological Sciences, Physics and Astronomy, Science Education and the remaining portions of Biological Sciences and Chemistry and Biochemistry not housed in the Molecular and Life Sciences Center next door. Valued at more than \$100 million, the project is under the direction of Hunt Construction, which has its west division branch office in Irvine, and is providing more than 300 construction-related jobs.

Last November, CSULB broke ground on a \$4.3 million, 10,500-square-foot addition to its School of Nursing Building. The single-story addition, which will be completed and ready for occupancy this fall, will house teaching and computer labs as well as administrative and department offices. Under the direction of the Cypress-based Taisei Construction Corp., this is the university's first addition to its nursing facilities since 1975.

"A report released by the university's Office of Economic Research noted that Cal State Long Beach generates an annual economic impact of more than \$1 billion in the Southern California region," Alexander noted. "The economists who prepared that report have indicated that because 25 to 30 percent of the university's students, faculty and staff live in the Orange County area, about 25 to 30 percent of that \$1 billion benefits Orange County."

Prepared by CSULB Professors Lisa Grobar and Joe Magaddino, the report explains that the university's direct impacts are measured by its expenditures on goods, services, salaries and benefits. The presence of the university also leads to indirect expenditures in the region, as suppliers to the campus spend on payroll and materials, and employees and pensioners spend their incomes in the local economy. Furthermore, the economic impact of student expenditures and the subsequent "multiplier" effects of all these factors are considerable.

"Put in other terms, Cal State Long Beach's economic activities generate \$2.8 million daily in the region's economy," Magaddino pointed out, averaging the university's annual economic impact of \$1.034 billion. "But the employment impact of the university is equally as significant. While the campus itself accounts for 8,162 jobs, university and student expenditures support an additional 9,060 indirect jobs within the region. That's a total of 17,222 jobs."

The report indicates that university expenditures, both direct and indirect, account for \$614.9 million while student expenditures equal approximately \$419.3 million, yielding the total economic impact of \$1.034 billion.

CSULB offers a total of 84 baccalaureate degrees, 66 master's degrees and two doctoral degrees through the university's eight colleges: Health and Human Services; Liberal Arts; Business Administration; Education; Engineering; Arts; Natural Sciences and Mathematics; and Continuing and Professional Education.

This fall, a new and very unique private high school campus will open in the City of Irvine.

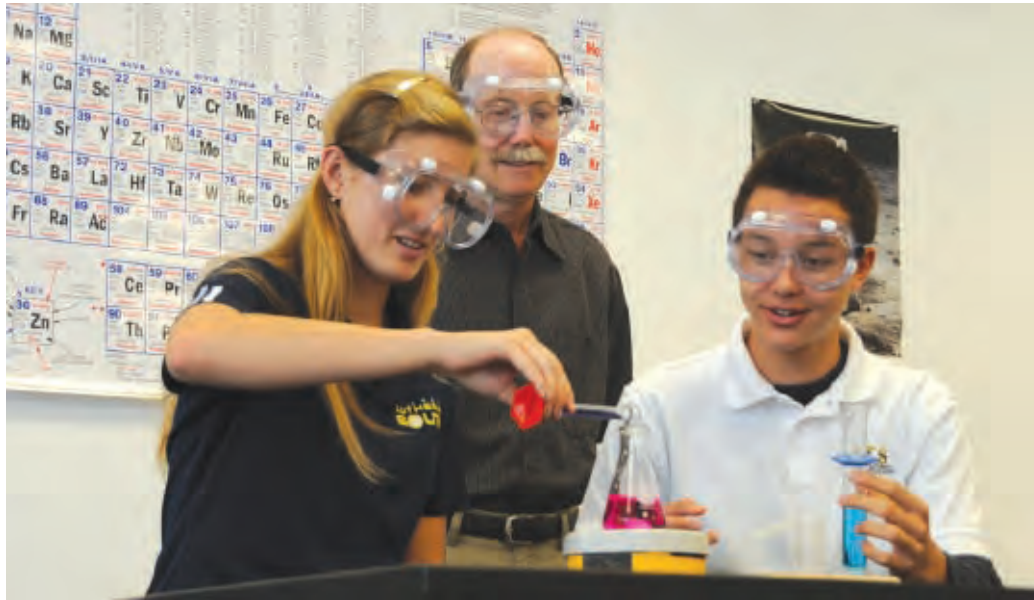
The students of this school, which opened at its interim location in central Irvine in 2007 and has quickly caught the attention of Orange County's educational community for broad based excellence, will continue to receive such amenities as laptop computers, SAT preparation classes, and individual college planning services as they always have. But now they will experience all this with an inimitable new view.

Crean Lutheran High School, Orange County's new Lutheran high school, is expected to move into its new sprawling 30-acre campus in the city's Woodbury District in October. The campus, which sits prominently in the district's scenic northeast side just minutes from the Irvine Spectrum, enjoys amazing vistas that extend to the Pacific Ocean. But for all the attention the school's location and its facilities are attracting, it's an altogether different kind of vision that continues to make CLHS one of the county's most progressive high schools.

New Business & Science Institute

As Crean Lutheran readies itself for a mid-October ribbon cutting for the new campus, school administrators are preparing to roll out the institution's brand new Business & Science Institute this fall, the goal of which is to provide students greater insight and real world experience into their lives through professional internships in these areas.

"Crean Lutheran is a school that is rooted in its commitment to providing a comprehensive, Christian worldview education," CLHS Principal Jeffrey Beavers explains. "And because a Christian worldview is comprehensive and affects every area of life, we want our students to become discerning and ethical Christian leaders

Participation in the Business & Science Institute is based on an application process that is limited to seniors and juniors. Among several criteria, the procedure requires upperclassmen to demonstrate academic and social readiness, culminating with a panel interview with school administrators and faculty members.

Prior to being placed, pre-service interns spend the first semester receiving training to learn corporate culture and decorum to help them become productive in the workplace.

"It is critically important that applicants display a passion for a particular area of study," comments Brian Underwood, CLHS Vice Principal for External Affairs. "Additionally, applicants must also demonstrate the requisite academic preparedness required for the higher order of thinking that will be expected of them in the

corporate and science arenas they enter."

There is no shortage of qualified students at CLHS, where the average overall SAT Subject Matter (e.g. SAT II) score is 691. LPA, Inc., one of the largest integrated architecture and design firms in California, is one Orange County company that has taken notice of the broad intellectual curiosity that exists at CLHS and has already embraced its students.

"This program has huge value," states Jon Mills, a principal at LPA. "It gets students a real feel for what it might be like to work in a particular career. It can be very inspiring, and I applaud Crean Lutheran for developing it."

The Crean Lutheran Business & Science Institute is further evidence of CLHS's ongoing commitment to becoming a "City on a Hill." Come October, the school with the view will have a campus to match.

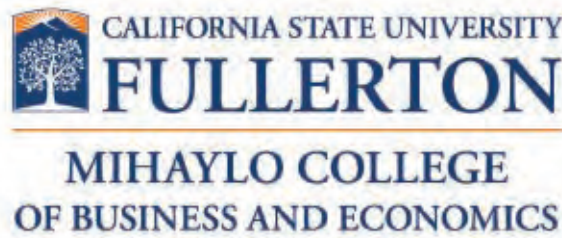
The MBA and other graduate curriculum at Mihaylo
